Robert Davis, Morro Bay: I am with the SLO bicycle club and I am here to inform you of the annual bike event, the 40th annual Lighthouse Fundraiser that will take place September 24th. There will be approx. 1,200 riders. The ride begins at 7:00 AM and proceeds along Hwy 1 from Cuesta College to Piedras Blancas. Some riders will be going up Old Creek Rd., others will be coming in to Cayucos to Hardy Park for a refreshment stop. In the afternoon on the way back to Cuesta, all cyclists will come back through Cayucos. The ride starts at 7:00 AM and ends at 5:00. The roads should be clear of cyclists by 4:30. Public Agencies

County Sheriff: Jason NeFores, Commander, Coastal Patrol Division

Sheriff Deputy Todd Steeb:

The Sheriff's Dept. had 129 calls for Cayucos. 11 were public disturbance, 2 theft, 1 trespassing, 1 burglary, and 1 domestic violence.

We have some new defibrillators. We have been in Paso Robles a lot. We did a "sweep" there with positive results.

Deputy Steeb: On September 18th, we may be getting 8 new employees.

CHP - Officer Jim Townsend

Officer Jim Townsend: The radar trailer, that has hopefully helped out, is being relocated.

School is back in session, watch for kids. Over Labor Day Weekend, there were 30 DUI arrests. No check points, just patrols. DUI arrests were "up". They were some county residents and some tourist. 30 was a lot. Help each other out, use the available resources. Tow trucks, buses, cabs, friends, whatever.

Co. Public Works - Jeremy Ghent

Frank Honeycutt: Clearly a high percentage of accidents involve alcohol. We clean up after the accidents. The preliminary studies of the painted bike lanes indicate that the traffic speeds before and after the painted lanes had no change. Maybe it would have more effect if the painted lanes were extended two or four more blocks. My opinion is that you will not see a change. Paso Robles just upgraded Pine St. and they had the same results, no change. They spent a lot of money on their project. The Cayucos project paint does not cost that much if you really want it.

The Villa Creek area is heavily patrolled by CHP. That area is a speed zone for CHP.

Connie Paine: As a bicycle rider, I feel like the painted lanes have made it safer for cyclists.

Margaret Ambrosavage: I think the painted lanes do give increased awareness of the bicycle lanes and cyclists.

Carol Baptiste: I agree. I like the painted bicycle lanes.

John Carsel: If we would like more paint, how would we go about that?

Frank Honeycutt: Take a vote and make a recommendation. The paint is not supposed to be that red.

That looks somewhat like a fire lane.

Fernie: In Santa Maria, there is a video camera and it seems to slow the traffic. Even a fake video box would probably work.

Frank Honeycutt: With regard to parallel parking on 3rd St, 4 people said "No", 3 people said "Yes" and 3 people said "Maybe". A slight simple majority. We would like to bring it to the LUC in November.

Paul Choucolas: How many houses are on third street? I've walked that before and there were a lot of vacancies.

Frank Honeycutt: We have had a request to remove a street light on Gilbert Ave. We are going to request that the light be turned off.

Public Comment: I live right there and I love that light. It is a great safety feature.

Frank Honeycutt: Well, get your friends and neighbors to send in their comments.

There was a request for some 15 min. parking spaces. Brian has been trying to contact Chamber of Commerce to no avail.

Bill Shea: We sent him a letter where we wanted them.

Margaret Ambrosavage: There was a letter sent in.

John Carsel: Margaret will follow up on that.

Bill Shea: 30 min., not 15 min.

Frank Honeycutt: Please clear that up in the letter.

The driver feedback sign that tells you how fast you are going, we may move it from Ocean Ave. to Old Creek Rd..

DeAnn Harland: Sidewalks. We have a needy sidewalk situation by the pharmacy. By D St., by the vacant lot by the drug store.

Frank Honeycutt: We'll look at it. Sidewalks don't compete well with higher priority items.

Larry Fishman: Thank you Public Works and Supervisor Gibson and Cherie Aispuro for repairs on Cottontail Creek Rd..

Paul Choucolas: With regard to the placement of the speed feedback sign, I see people coming off the freeway headed toward Paso Robles going faster than drivers coming down Old Creek Rd..

Frank Honeycutt: We have an easy way to gauge that. That speed sign may be the one by Steve Beightler's house.

There is a re-alignment of Public Safety in the works with the State. As of Oct. 1, State prisoners will be coming to the county facilities. We think we can do a better job with less cost but it does put a strain on our probation officers.

Should we propose a heritage tree program, will it turn out to be a dead end with the county. We are looking to see if it is feasible.

A couple of houses are pending that require more information.

A proposed house on Richard Ave. will go before the Planning Commission on September 22nd. for approval. There are still details that need to come from Public Works regarding a hillside variance.

Swallow Creek is also on the Planning Commission agenda for September 22nd.
